Creating an emergency kit for living in an RV is crucial to ensure your safety and preparedness during unexpected situations.

## **COMPREHENSIVE RV EMERGENCY KIT CHECKLIST**

### **PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION AND DOCUMENTS:**

- Driver's license, passport, and other important identification
- RV registration, insurance documents, and any relevant permits
- Emergency contact information and medical records
- Travel itinerary and reservations

### **FIRST AID KIT:**

- Adhesive bandages, sterile gauze, and adhesive tape
- Antiseptic wipes or solution
- Tweezers, scissors, and a thermometer
- Pain relievers, antihistamines, and any necessary prescription medications
- Antacids, anti-diarrheal medication, and laxatives

### **COMMUNICATION AND NAVIGATION:**

- Fully charged cell phone and a backup power bank
- Emergency radio (battery-powered or hand-crank)
- GPS device or smartphone with GPS apps
- Road atlas or printed maps

### **SHELTER AND WARMTH:**

- Emergency blankets or space blankets
- Sleeping bags or warm blankets
- Extra clothing suitable for different weather conditions (e.g., rain gear, warm layers)

### **FOOD AND WATER:**

- Bottled water (at least one gallon per person per day for at least three days)
- Non-perishable food items such as canned goods, granola bars, nuts, and dried fruits
- Manual can opener
- Eating utensils and disposable plates/cups

### **TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT:**

- Multipurpose tool or Swiss Army knife
- Flashlights with extra batteries
- Duct tape, zip ties, and rope
- Basic set of hand tools (screwdriver, pliers, wrench)
- Jumper cables and tire pressure gauge

### **EMERGENCY LIGHTING:**

- LED lanterns or flashlight with extra batteries
- Candles or battery-operated tea lights

### **SANITATION AND PERSONAL HYGIENE:**

- Hand sanitizer and wet wipes
- Toilet paper and trash bags
- Soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, and hygiene items

### **FIRE SAFETY:**

- Fire extinguisher
- Matches or lighter in a waterproof container
- Firewood or fire starter cubes

### **CASH AND FINANCIAL ITEMS:**

- Cash in small denominations
- Credit/debit cards and important financial information

### **MISCELLANEOUS:**

- Insect repellent
- Sunscreen
- Portable phone charger
- Pet supplies (if traveling with pets)

### **IMPORTANT CONTACTS:**

- Emergency numbers (911, local police, fire department)  
Contact information for family, friends, and your RV dealer/repair service

\*Regularly review and update your emergency kit to ensure that all items are in good condition and that your kit meets your current needs. Additionally, make sure everyone in your RV knows the location of the emergency kit and how to use its contents in case of an emergency.
